All the students had plenty of energy to dance and get up and do it. Here is what some people had to say.

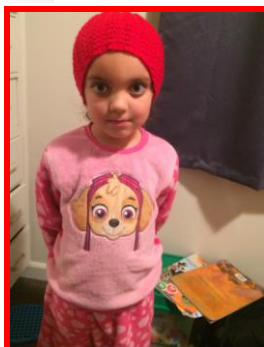
1. "I love it and want to do it everyday".
